

Human evolution revolved around the natural consequences, as we evolved from hunter-gatherers to modern age technologically equipped human society, our connect with nature is getting lost. **Arne Naess**, distinguished two paradigms of environmental philosophy and he called “shallow” and “deep ecology,” primarily on the basis of a fundamental division in environmental ethics. In the present anthropocene era, human civilization faces nature’s fury in every climatic event like flood, cyclone, landslide etc. A separate school of thought was developed as **Deep ecology**, a recent branch of ecological philosophy that considers humankind as an integral part of its environment. We, humans, have an innate connection with the nature and our physiology, physiology and health correlates with the surrounding nature. Human identity exists at the intersections of the ancient cycles of air, water and soil.
