



Dear Sir/Madam,

Vector Borne Diseases (VBDs) are major public health concern in our Country. Every year, World Mosquito Day (WMD) is observed on 20th August to commemorate discovery of Sir Ronald Ross in 1897 establishing human malaria transmission through female Anopheles mosquitoes. The observance of WMD includes intensified activities towards vector control to interrupt the transmission and supportive activities like social mobilization and advocacy involving various stakeholders at different levels.

This year the theme for WMD is '*Accelerating the Fight Against Malaria for a More Equitable World*' which emphasizes the urgent need to intensify efforts toward malaria elimination, ensuring equitable access to prevention, diagnosis, and treatment services especially for the most vulnerable and marginalized populations. As you are aware that NCVBDC deals in five mosquito borne diseases namely Malaria, Dengue, Chikungunya, Lymphatic Filariasis, and sand fly borne Visceral Leishmaniasis. The importance of entomological surveillance and vector control under Integrated Vector Management is one of the crucial strategies for prevention, control and elimination of Malaria and other vector borne diseases under NCVBDC.

In view of above, it is important that we all should observe WMD with due seriousness and commitment. To mark WMD-2025 meaningfully, you are requested to plan the activities focusing on:

- IEC/BCC activities at State, District, and Block levels. Focus outreach in malaria-endemic and high-risk areas with active participation from community leaders, school children, frontline workers, and civil society.
- Use of digital and social media platforms to promote key messages on malaria prevention, early diagnosis, and timely treatment. Ensure dissemination of key messages of all VBDs under NCVBDC including Dengue and Chikungunya while disseminating the messages.
- Coordination with departments such as Rural Development, Urban Local Bodies, Education, and Tribal Welfare for integrated and sustainable vector control efforts.
- Strengthening of vector control through source reduction, and community-led environmental management.
- Intensification of case detection and complete treatment as per national guidelines.

I sincerely hope that we all will reaffirm our commitment to the national goal of Malaria Elimination by 2030 by intensifying efforts and ensuring that no one is left behind in this journey towards a malaria-free and healthier India.
