*University School of Mass Communication: Change in the nomenclature of the Master's programme - In its Academic Council meeting held on Oct. 29, 2010, the university approved the change in the nomenclature of the regular master's programme from Master of Mass Media (MMM) to Master in Mass Communication (MMC), the latter being recognized by the UGC. This was in response to the long standing demand of the students who now would face no difficulty whatsoever in any public or private institution in terms of recognition of their degree globally.

3. Innovations in curricular design and transaction:

1. University School of Mass Communication: UNESCO Standards for MMC Syllabi – Media industry in India is growing at a fast pace next only to telecommunications. This follows dynamic socio-political changes over the last sixty years. In view of this, the BOS of USMC decided to convert the MMC Syllabus into a dynamic document capable of reflecting the ever changing demands of the industry and society, in line with the recommendations of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO). In this respect, GGSIPU's regular master's programme of mass communication has become not only unique but very contemporary too.

2. The University has made sustained and ceaseless efforts to employ innovative teaching-learning methodology. In fact it had shifted the focus from 'teacher-centered pedagogy' to 'learner-centered pedagogy' by introducing projects, field trips, internship, industrial training, etc. Exposure to facilities like Overhead projector, LCD projector, Computer and Internet in teaching-learning method has enabled the students to keep pace with the modern technology development and to make them globally competent.

4. Inter-disciplinary programmes started:

Innovative Inter-disciplinary programmes of LL.M.(Cyber Crime and Cyber Law) is being designed for the academic year 2011-12.

5. Examination reforms implemented:

A. Reforms in conduct of Common Entrance Tests (CETs) :

- (i) On line Admission Form submission has been introduced. This facilitates the candidates to submit online Application Fee and have access to the copy of Admit Card.
- (ii) In order to ensure that no cases of impersonation take place, the entire data in the form is scanned and enrollment numbers and Test Centres are allotted to the students randomly through an in-house developed software.
- (iii) The qualified candidates are called for counselling.
- (iv) The record of the admitted students is updated at the counselling venue and a computerized receipt is generated for the students.
- (v) To make the counselling process transparent, the status of the seats is displayed online indicating filled seats, vacant seats and the rank of the last admitted students.

(vi) Every day, in the evening, after completion of the counselling, seat status is displayed on the University Website. It helps to the students appearing for the counselling on the subsequent days.

(vii) The list of the admitted students is provided to the examination branch and affiliated colleges.

B. Instructions for photographs :

a) The candidate should affix his/ her recent colour photograph with white background of size 3" X4" your face should cover about 75% of the photo (without attestation) taken on or after 1st January, 2011. The photograph should be pasted (not stapled) in the space marked for it ;

b) Photograph should not have cap, googles, etc.(Spectacles are allowed). The face of the candidate should cover about 75% of the photo. The photo should not be hazy. The candidate is also advised to write his/ her name and application number on the reverse side of the photograph before affixing on the form ; the candidate should keep two identical photographs with him/ her, in reserve which may have to be used at the time of Entrance Test/ Counselling/ Admission, in case of doubt regarding identity ;

c) The candidate should keep two identical photographs with him/ her, in reserve which may have to be used at the time of Entrance Test/ Counselling/ Admission, in case of doubt regarding the identify ; and,

d) Visible mark of identification: Candidate should mention visible mark of identification.

C. CET Cell is continuously enriched with relevant software and electronic gadgets. It is pertinent to mention that results are always declared in a time bound manner.

D. Declaration of Results :

The results are declared on the website of the University. This ensures that the parents have the access to performance record of their wards.

E. Reform for conduct of End-Term Examinations :

- a) Based on the data base of the admitted students, examination department generates computerized attendance sheet and admit cards.
- b) The cover page of the answer sheet contains an OMR Sheet consisting of two parts.
- c) A student appearing for the examination has to fill up the first part of the OMR sheet with the personal details such as roll number, etc. the second part is for the use of evaluators. The evaluator has to fill up the marks obtained by the student in the remaining part.
- d) The first part of the OMR sheet containing the student details, is detached after the completion of the examination. It helps the examination department in creating database of the students appeared for the examination.
- e) After evaluation of the answer sheet, second part of the OMR sheet, containing the marks, is detached and provided to the examination department. The marks are scanned by the specialized scanners in the examination department and the results are declared immediately.
- f) A copy of the result is uploaded on the University Website.

As part of the First Phase of construction two Blocks, namely, School of Biotechnology and School of Chemical Technology became operational from August 16, 2010. The first classes of various Schools, namely, School of Basic & Applied Sciences, Environment Management, Humanities and Social Sciences and the School of Law started operating from new campus at Dwarka. The Library became operational too. The first phase of construction has around 26 blocks. Some of the unique features of this Campus is: rain water harvesting, recycling of water, energy conservation practices, vehicle free and disable friendly pedestrians, pathways.

2. New University Server set up at Dwarka Campus with advance technology for serving University.
3. University has received 1 Gbps link under NKN through NIC.

This University has been a professional University based in Delhi. All the faculty members and staff are well trained to use computers and e-learning resources for smooth conduct of academic and administrative processes.

30. Financial aid to students:

Student Welfare Department: An amount of Rs.52,15,250/- (Rupees Fifty Two Lacs Fifteen Thousand Two Hundred Fifty Only) was disbursed as Fee Concession to the students belonging to Economically Weaker Section (EWS) for the financial year 2010-11.
